Foggy conditions bring cheer to wheat farmers

Haryana is witnessing a dip in temperature, with the average minimum falling by 0.3°C as compared to Tuesday when the state recorded a fall if 2.8°C. Despite this, it remains near normal. The state recorded its lowest temperature of 7.8°C in Hisar. Thick fog, which has

reduced visibility and caused inconvenience to motorists. has proved to be a boon for wheat farmers, as these conditions are highly conducive to wheat cultivation. IMD experts predict that foggy conditions will persist in the coming days.

Wheat is cultivated on nearly 4.72 lakh acres in Karnal district, where around 85 per cent of the sowing has already been completed by farmers.

Residents of glitzy NCR districts of Gurugram and Faridabad, who have four ministers from the area, are up in arms for the failure of their public representatives to even acknowledge or raise the issue in the House, let alone find a solution.

Gurugramars are taking to social media to vent their anger against Gurgaon MLA Mukesh Sharma and Badshahpur MLA Rao Narbir, who, ironically, is also the state Environment Minister, for being silent while the city seeks the 'right to breathe'.

The residents are posting smog pictures and videos, from affordable housing areas to Rs 100-crore luxury societies, highlighting how even money can't buy good air in Gurugram. The average air quality of the cities remains 'very poor' and has slipped to 'severe' in many parts over the past four days.

Pollution Control Board teams cite dust pollution by construction activities, construction and waste dumping, tattered roads, waste burning and vehicular emissions as key

Gurugram has been in the grip of smog for past many weeks, severely impacting the air quality.

"The city is seeking the right to breathe. It's shocking that MLAs who made tall promises of eradicating civic crises are silent. There is chaos and GRAP is failing, but who cares?" said citybased environmentalist

Vaishali Rana Chandra. "People have trusted them for the third term and annual pollution resolution was one of the key expectations of Gurugram. Everybody was expecting both star MLAs of the city to raise the issue in the Assembly and get the government to act. This year, basic steps like getting smog guns, etc., are also not being taken and people have been left to fend for themselves," said Praveen Malik of the United Association of New Gurugram.

A team of Jhajjar health officials has busted a racket involved in pre-natal sex determination at Bulandshahr (Uttar Pradesh).

Two workers belonging to UP along with a tout have been booked under the PC-PNDT Act. The ultrasound test of expectant mothers were being conducted at a house in the Shikarpur area through a portable machine.

"We got a tip-off that sex determination of an unborn baby is being done in Shikarnur (Bulandshahr) and pregnant women are being taken there for this test. Acting swiftly, a decoy customer was taken to Shikarpur by a team of local health officials on Wednesday," said Dr Brahamdeep Singh, Civil Surgeon, Jhajjar.

He informed that an anganwadi worker-Geeta—took the decoy customer to a house in Shikarpur where an ultrasound test was illegally performed on the customer by a one Subodh using a portable ultrasound machine. He disclosed the gender of the baby to the decoy customer who then signaled the raiding team standing outside the house.

'Thereafter, the team raided the house. Subodh, in an attempt to flee, got his leg fractured and was nabbed by the team. Two touts — Geeta and ASHA worker Sangeeta were also detained" said Brahamdeep, adding that an FIR was registered against the trio in the Shikarpur

SC: State can't claim adverse possession of citizens' property

NEW DELHI, NOVEMBER 20

The State cannot claim adverse possession of the property of private citizens, the Supreme Court has ruled.

"Allowing the State to appropriate private property through adverse possession would undermine the constitutional rights of citizens and erode public trust in the government," a Bench led by Justice Vikram Nath said.

The Bench dismissed the Government's Haryana appeal raising a claim of adverse possession over a piece of land measuring 18 Biswas Pukhta located at NH-10 connecting Delhi and Ballabhgarh.

The Bench — which also included Justice PB Varale dismissed an appeal of the Haryana Government challenging the Punjab and Haryana High Court order restoring the possession of land to a private party in which the state's Public Works Department (PWD)



GOVT'S PLEA DISMISSED

A Bench led by Justice Vikram Nath dismissed the Haryana Government's appeal raising a claim of adverse possession over a piece of land measuring 18 Biswas Pukhta located at NH-10 connecting Delhi and Ballabhgarh.

has staked its claim.

"It is a fundamental principle that the State cannot claim adverse possession over the property of its own citizens," it said, citing its verdict in Vidya Devi vs. State of HP (2020)."We find no merit in the appellants' con-

tentions. The high court's judgment is based on sound legal principles and correct appreciation of evidence. The plaintiffs (private party) have established their ownership of the suit property, and the State cannot claim adverse possession against its own citizens," the top court noted.

"Allowing the State to


appropriate private property through adverse possession would undermine the constitutional rights of citizens and erode public trust in the government. Therefore, the appellants' (state government) plea adverse possession is untenable in law," it said, relying on revenue records entries which established the ownership of the land in question in favour of the private party. "While it is true that revenue entries do not by themselves confer title, they are admissible as evidence of possession and can support a claim of ownership when corroborated by other evidence," it said.


